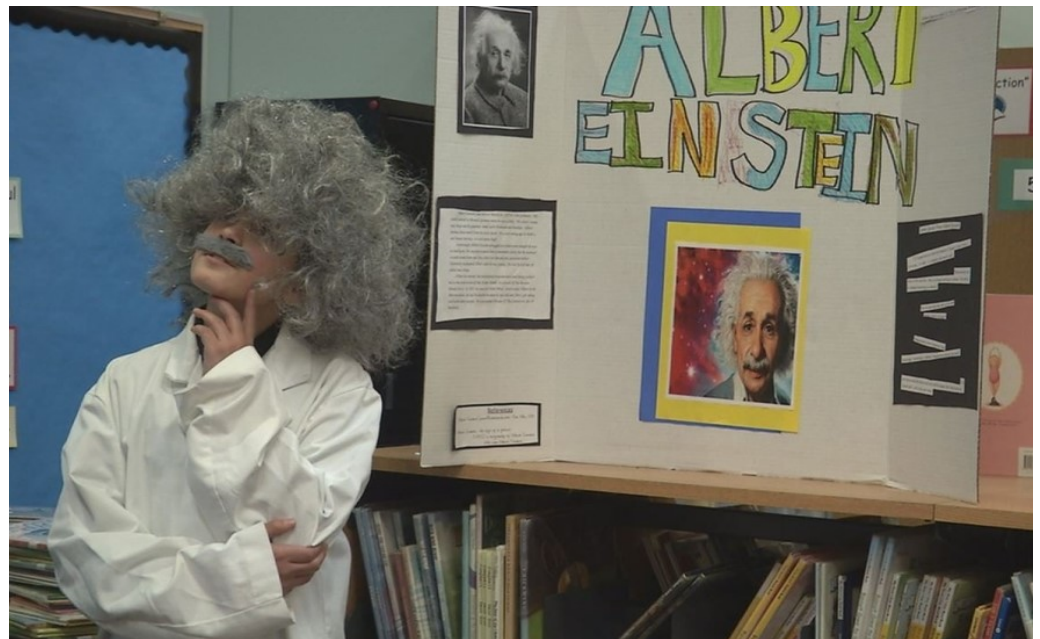

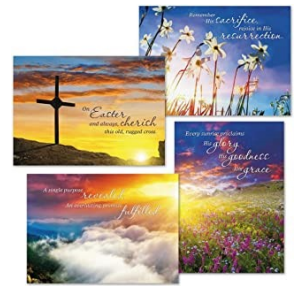

From the Pastor's Desk

My family and I have been in Greeley for six months, and it is feeling like home. Thank you for so warmly bringing our family into the life of Trinity. May God continue to take us all up into his own life by his Spirit as we gather together as Christ's body.

When we arrived last October, most plants had died or become dormant. For most of our time here, Greeley has been sleeping, so to speak. Now the earth is springing to life. Trees are using last year's energy to put out leaves and blossoms; farmers are using last year's seeds to plant their fields; gardeners are getting ready to transplant tomatoes and other annuals as the world becomes habitable once again.

Is the soil of your heart ready for spring? Some gardeners till the soil, others don't. Many spread a layer of compost. We can think in similar ways about the soil of our hearts. Has your heart been compacted and hardened by repeated conflict without resolution? Are you holding on to grudges or pain? These and other forms of heartache can prevent the seed of God's Word from penetrating and developing roots. Do you find your attention dominated by anxiety? Or is it captured by earthly pursuits? The seed of God's Word needs space in your mind and heart—it needs attention—or it will be choked out.

Prayer opens up space for God's Word to land in optimal soil. It invites change of perspective, rearrangement of priorities, redirection of hope. "The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:5-7).

Prayer is vital for faith; it is also vital for your neighbor. Pray for your family and friends, neighbors and neighborhood, leaders, city, nation, the world. Pray for both earthly and spiritual goods—for security from violence and from the attacks of the devil, for peace amid family difficulties and amid spiritual turmoil, for health of body and of soul, for relief from physical ailments and faith to bear them patiently. Pray for Trinity Lutheran Church and School, for our district and synod, and for the Christian Church throughout the world. Pray that all would be saved and come to the knowledge of the truth (1 Timothy 2:4).

Prayer invites the Word like a question invites an answer. It invites God to act. What's more, God wants the invitation. What a gift.

On Thursday, May 2, the National Day of Prayer, we will join our LWML in a prayer service at 10 a.m. to pray for our nation and all of the above. This will be a special time to unite our attention toward God, inviting him to work in the hearts of us and others. May God grant us faith to lend our attention daily to God for the benefit of our neighbor and the world, and so that the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard [our] hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:7).

School Happenings

Preschool & K-8

Trinity family,

As this year closes, we see changes on the horizon... see the Board of Education letter in this newsletter for an overview. We are seeking candidates for elementary positions and preschool classroom assistants, so please refer candidates to Board members.

LIVING HISTORY – This year's spring production will be Living History museum-walk through the hallways of our school. Each student in K-8 will be a character from the past and share their story. The evening begins at 6:00 in the gym with a performance by the preschool students. We will then auction off the 2023-24 school quilt. Each year, the Trinity Quilters create a quilt based on our school theme; this year the theme was "Connected". After that, you are free to walk the halls and meet the historical characters. Starting at 6:45, there will be a bake sale in the school cafeteria. You can purchase items to enjoy an evening snack (there will be coffee), or purchase items to take home. Funds raised at the bake sale go to the project to improve signage on the Trinity property.

On May 3, elementary students will spend the morning helping to beautify the Trinity property; in the afternoon, they will have Field Day. Preschool will do their own special events on May 20 & 21.

The school will observe teacher appreciation week the week of May 6-10.

GRADUATION AND TEACHER RECOGNITION – On Tuesday evening, May 21, there will be a service in the church at 6:00 p.m. We will recognize the 8th graders who are graduating and the teachers who are leaving. There will be an ice cream social after the service. The congregation is invited to join school families for this event.

And just like that, another school year is done. May 22 is the last day of classes; school dismisses at noon. May 23 & 24 are reserved for staff meetings. Summer childcare will start on Tuesday, May 28.

Pray that we have a good summer – that the Lord quickly send candidates to fill staffing vacancies, that we continue to enroll more students and that our summer school staff and students have days full of learning and fun.

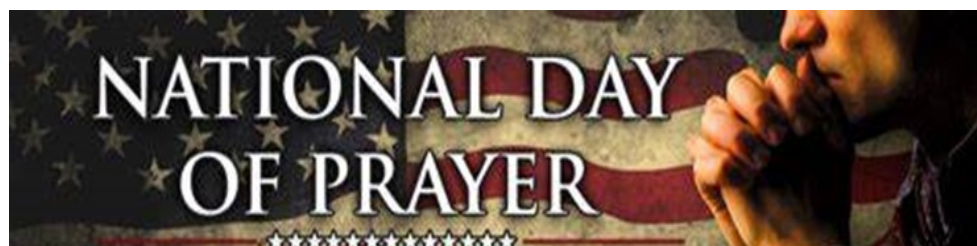

I shared this article a few years ago with Trinity and recently I have had requests to run it again, so here we go:

The Death of Common Sense by Lori Borgman



Let us mourn the passing of an old friend. His name is Common Sense. C.S. lived a long life but died from heart failure. He was as old as the ages and devoted his life to schools, hospitals, homes and offices, helping folks live without fanfare and foolishness. For decades, petty rules and frivolous lawsuits held no power over C.S. He was credited with teaching valued lessons like knowing when to come in out of the rain, working hard, and that life isn't always fair.

C.S. lived by sound financial policies (“Don’t spend more than you earn”) and reliable teaching (“The adult is in charge, not the child”). A veteran of the Industrial Revolution, the Great Depression, and the Technological Revolution, C.S. survived trends of feminism, body piercing, bilingual education and new math. His health declined with the arrival of the “If-It-Only-Helps-One-Person-It’s Worth-It” virus. His waning strength proved no match for the ravages of incomprehensible regulations. He watched in pain as people became ruled by self-serving politicians, government auditors, and college professors who’d formerly been in jail.

His health deteriorated as schools implemented zero-tolerance policies, resulting in six year-old boys charged with sexual harassment for kissing, teens suspended for using mouthwash after lunch, or teachers fired for reprimanding unruly students. C.S. finally lost his will to live as the Ten Commandments were declared contraband, churches became businesses, criminals got better treatment than victims, and judges began to make laws rather than enforce them.

As the end neared, C.S. was overwhelmed by regulations for low-flow toilets and “green” items that cost more to make than they saved. Finally, when told that homeowners groups wouldn’t allow flying the flag, he breathed his last.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Right and Wrong, his wife Discretion, his daughter Responsibility and his son Reason. His funeral was small, because few knew he’d died.

Note from the Editor: Growing up on a farm, we of course had a family garden. In the spring, the whole garden had to be worked in preparation for planting. Some areas needed the remains of last year's plants removed. Other areas needed the weeds pulled. Still others needed a hoe taken to them to break up the hardened soil. (One year I wasn't paying attention and got into the asparagus patch rather aggressively with the hoe. That's when I learned you pull weeds and salt asparagus patches, you *never* hoe them.) Once the garden was planted, daily care was required. Watering, pulling weeds, protection from insects, cold snaps or hail, and fertilizing were some of the ways to care for the garden. There is a lot of tender loving care along with the hard work for a garden to bear fruit. Gardens remind me of relationships, they also need tended to with loving care. I often hear the key to a good relationship is communication. While gardens are visual and I can see if they need water, have too much water, need weeds pulled, etc, relationships with people are multi-faceted and I may not see what is needed. I have to listen to them through their words and actions. Relationships with people in this world can be complicated, and that brings me to consider my relationship with God. How do I loving care for my relationship with our Lord and Savior? He cares for me, each and every day, providing what I need (not necessarily what I want) so that I bear fruit. He faithfully tends the garden that I reside in. I care for the relationship by repenting of my sins, baring my heart and soul to Him through prayer and by cultivating the relationships He has given me. Communication is key and to that I strive to pray without ceasing. May you give tender care to the gardens in your life and bountifully bear the fruit the Master Gardner has so patiently cared for in you. *“Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18*

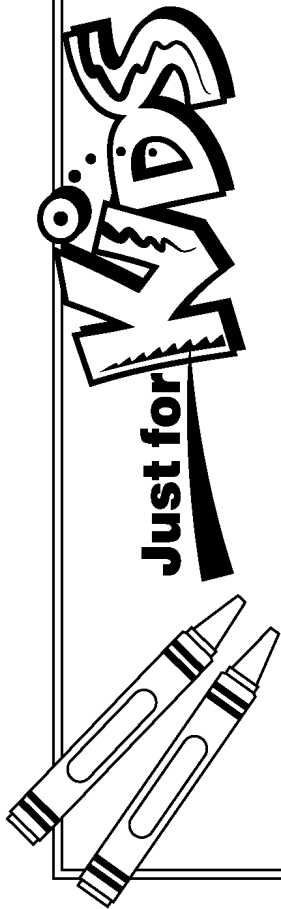
